Parental Update 95

I'm writing to you shortly after the announcement of the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. Many of us will, I know, feel a sense of loss at this time. We may never have met her, or even be avid followers of the royals; but nonetheless Queen Elizabeth was an unchanging part of our lives and, for many of us, and a profound example of service and endurance. In short, she was a constant in times when the only other constant has seemed to be the unending turmoil of life in the twenty-first century.

As Christians we can echo one Psalmist who said "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble" (if grief can properly be described as 'trouble'), or another, who more simply said God "is my rock". In special Assemblies today I have sought to share something of that comfort – a comfort which all of us can know, whatever our faith – with our students.

Today, I am grateful for the example of someone who lived their lives believing that our time here is not about what we *own*, or even about what we *learn* (vital as the latter is); it's about what we *choose to do* with the gift of life each of us has been given. Her Majesty chose to give her life to serving others, and to serving God. That, I believe, is the hallmark of a life well lived.
