Dr Silverstone writes...

"We have had several conversations recently with parents and carers who are concerned about their children and the potential for involvement in gang-related activity. In some instances, parents are unsure who their children are socialising with, or they may have noticed a change in their child's behaviour. In other cases, they are concerned that their child may be being threatened or being coerced into behaving in ways that they would otherwise avoid.

"The NSPCC has some very clear advice about gangs and gang-related activity, including what gangs are, how gang recruitment works and the potential for criminal exploitation. It is worth looking at for all parents, not just those who have specific concerns. You will find it here.

"We would also encourage you to speak to us at school if you have any concerns of this nature – contact your child's Head of Year or Dr Silverstone, the safeguarding lead. Alternatively, you can email the safeguarding team on <u>safeguarding@stmargaretsacademy.com</u>."
