Parental Update 131

Good afternoon! As ever, I trust our fortnightly *Update* finds you in good health and spirits. And I also trust you received our 'special edition' *Update* earlier this week, which outlined arrangements for our Carol Service in just under a fortnight's time. <u>Attendance</u>

Mr Gibbons writes: "You may have noticed that there has been a much higher focus on attendance this year compared to previous years. The national picture tells us that school absence nationwide remains at a worryingly high rate since the pandemic. Research has proven a link between school absence and reduced outcomes in adult life.

"Here at St Margaret's, our year-to-date attendance figure for Years 7 to 11 is 91.1%. At the same time last year it was 93.6%. So I'd like to stress again the importance of school attendance. A single missed day, for example, is 5 hours of education lost that needs to be caught up.

"A common cause of absence this year so far has been illness. While we appreciate that in a numbers of cases, the symptoms some bugs and viruses may best be cared for at home, please do consider the severity of the illness before opting to remove children from education. After all, one of our school values is resilience! If in doubt, please send your child in and we can always call and ask for them to be collected if they absolutely cannot cope.

"At St Margaret's, we are pride ourselves in supporting all students to reach their full potential. Please support us in doing so by making school attendance a matter of priority with your child(ren)."

A new School Management Information system

In recent months, the school has begun the process of changing IT systems with the aim of using only one system for all our various school functions. This is an exciting development for us as it will streamline a range of different activities for us as a school and for you as parents and carers. At the moment we use several different apps or systems such as ParentMail and Class Charts. From 9th January 2024 onwards, we will begin a phased introduction of some new software called Arbor. Parents and carers will still be able to use ParentPay to deposit money on their child's account. The option to add money *via* Arbor will not be available until later in 2024. Please be assured that all money left on your child's account will be automatically transferred to your new accounts on Arbor.

Arbor will become our main form of communication between home and school, it will be our payments system for school meals and trips, it will share attendance and behaviour data, it will set out homework for pupils, and it will share reports on attainment. This will allow you to use one app for all matters relating to school.

We are asking that all parents and carers download the Arbor app (available from the <u>App Store</u> and <u>Google Play</u>) before the end of the year as, from January, we will be rolling out the new functions.

Detailed instructions will be emailed out to parents and carers from January, but there are a few things to keep in mind before attempting to log in for the first time.

- To log-in, parents and guardians must have an email address on file with the school. If you have not currently supplied the school with a contact email address please get in touch via admin@stmargaretsacademy and let us know your child's name and date of birth.
- Parents and carers have separate accounts to access, but this will only work if you have unique email addresses. If you share an email address this may causes difficulties for the system.
- If you have more than one child in our school you should be able to access all of their details via the one account. If, when you log in in January, you cannot see all your children on Arbor, please contact school and we will link the accounts correctly.

Please download the app as soon as possible and look out for an email with instructions on how to access Arbor from 9th January!
