- All students will be dismissed from the Cathedral at after the Carol Service (around 1:30pm).
- Year 7 students who are entitled to Free School Meals will be provided with a packed lunch at the Cathedral.

Please be aware that there is currently a yellow weather warning for wind in force on Thursday; the wind may "potentially" cause "some travel disruption". It would be wise to allow extra time for travelling.
